CITY OF BISMARCK

Ordinance No. 6308

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND RE-ENACT SECTION 9-04-04 OF THE BISMARCK CODE OF ORDINANCES (REV.) RELATING TO DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF SALARY PLAN.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF BISMARCK, NORTH DAKOTA:

Section 1. Amendment. Section 9-04-04 of the City of Bismarck Code of Ordinances (1986 Rev.) relating to Development and Implementation of Salary Plan is hereby amended and re-enacted as follows:

*9-04-04. Development and Implementation of Salary Plan.*

1. The personnel director shall prepare and submit annually for the approval of the civil service commission a salary plan applicable to all positions in the civil service. In establishing a salary plan consideration shall be given to wages prevailing in business and industry in this city and vicinity for comparable positions, the pay levels of other municipalities and public units in the area, and the city's ability to pay. The salary plan must be comprised of salary ranges showing minimum and maximum rates for each class of position.

2. Following approval of the salary plan by the civil service commission, the personnel director shall submit the plan to the board of city commissioners for its approval.

3. Upon approval by the board of city commissioners, the plan shall constitute the official salary plan for the civil service of the city, and no base salary or wage payment in excess of the maximum rate or less than the minimum rate established for a class or position may be paid to any employee holding a position in that class.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect following final passage, adoption and publication.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Bismarck, North  
Dakota, as follows:

1. Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 40-22 of the North Dakota Century Code, Street Improvement District Number Five Hundred Eighteen (SI518) consists of 140 blocks in six units of asphalt resurfacing (patch, level, mill, overlay, chip seal, curb repair, alley repair), reconstruction and related items. Given the size of the district, it will bid in two phases, Phase A and Phase B, to allow for two separate contracts under one assessment district.

2.
